Description

The Beachtek DXA-POCKET is a two-channel, compact audio adapter for camcorders or DSLR cameras. It is ideal for the Blackmagic Pocket Cinema Camera. This adapter is designed to easily attach wireless mics and small, self-powered, camera mounted microphones such as the popular Rode VideoMics that have unbalanced mini-plug connectors.

The DXA-POCKET is very easy to set up and use. Exceptionally low noise preamplifiers provide very clean, wide bandwidth audio for full rich sound. Dual trim controls allow you to adjust the signal levels independently while the VU meters make it easy to set the precise recording levels for optimum results. The rugged extruded aluminum chassis has an integrated mounting shoe which can be used to either attach a wireless receiver or as a comfortable hand grip with the supplied rubber insert. Its compact size fits neatly under or over the camera for plenty of flexibility.

Features

Inputs

- Two mono mini-jack connectors
- One stereo mini-jack connector

Unbalanced stereo mini-jack with a detachable output cable



Adapter Connectors and Controls


Front Panel

- 1 POWER Switch
 Main power switch for adapter
- PWR LED
 Green indicates power on and good battery condition.
 Red indicated low battery voltage
- L and R Trim Controls
 Each channel has a trim control that adjusts the input signal,
- 4 VU Meter
 Indicates the sound level in dB for channel
- 5 A/B Switch
 Calibrates the VU meter for high or low reading.



Side Panel

- 6 L and R Inputs
 Connect mono mics to these inputs.
- 7 ST Input
 Connect stereo mics to this input
- OUT Jack
 This jack outputs the amplified mic level signal from the adapter for connection to the camera. Use the supplied output cable to connect to the MIC input on the camera.



Setup Guide

Battery Installation

- The DXA-POCKET operates on one 9 volt battery. We recommend that you use either an alkaline or lithium type battery for the longest operating time.
- 2) To install the battery unlatch the drawer by pushing in and over on the drawer front, releasing and sliding the drawer out. Insert the battery with the "+" positive terminal lined up with the "+" indicator on the battery compartment. Slide the battery drawer closed until it clicks into place.

Front Accessory Shoe


This can be used to mount a wireless receiver – simply remove the rubber insert from the shoe. Alternatively, the accessory shoe can be used as a comfortable grip by adding the supplied rubber insert.


Mounting the Adapter to the Camera

The adapter can be mounted under or over the camera. See the next two pages.

Mounting Under Camera


- 1) Line up the mounting bolt on top of the adapter to the tripod hole on the underside of the camera. Carefully turn the adapter mounting knob on the front panel to the right, to screw the adapter squarely into the camera. Snug the adapter to the camera, but do not over tighten.
- 2) For the Blackmagic cameras, you can also mount the supplied aluminum shoe to the top of the camera with the slotted screws to be used as an accessory shoe.





Mounting Over the Camera

- 1) Attach the supplied brass mounting foot to the underside of the adapter with the Allen head bolt. Tighten with the supplied Allen wrench.
- 2) Slide the adapter onto the camera hot shoe and lock in place. For the Blackmagic cameras, attach the supplied aluminum shoe to the top of the camera with either one or two of the supplied slotted screws. Slide the adapter onto this shoe and lock in place.
- 3) You can also mount the second supplied aluminum shoe to the top of the adapter with the 2 slotted screws to be used as an accessory shoe.



Initial Setup

- 1) Be sure that the camera and adapter are switched off.
- 2) Connect the supplied output cable from the OUT of the DXA-POCKET to the MIC in on the camera.
- If your camera has manual audio controls, set the gain to a low setting. See Advanced Operation for more details.
- 4) For the Blackmagic Pocket Camera set the audio menu as follows:

| a) | Microphone Input | 0% |
|----|----------------------------|------------|
| b) | Ch 1 and Ch 2 Input Levels | Mic |
| c) | Ch 1 Input | 50% * |
| d) | Ch 2 uses Ch 1 Input | No |
| e) | Ch 2 Input | 50% * |
| f) | Speaker Volume | 50 to 100% |

- 5) Set the A/B VU meter calibration switch on the adapter to A for Blackmagic cameras, or to B for all other cameras.
- 6) Connect mono mics to the L and / or R inputs on the adapter. Connect stereo mics to the ST input. Note that if you only using a single mono mic that has a TRS connector like the popular Rode VideoMic, you can plug this into the ST input. This way you can record audio to both channels at the same time at different audio levels. You should set one channel at a slightly lower level to use as a fallback channel in case the other one gets distorted from an overly hot signal.
- 7) Plug your headphones into the phone jack on the camera to monitor the audio.

Basic Operation

After following the above Initial Setup, you should be ready to start recording.

- 1) Turn the adapter PWR switch ON. The power LED should light green indicating good battery voltage. Red indicates low battery warning.
- 2) Adjust the LEFT and RIGHT level controls to give you an average reading of between 0dB and -12dB on the VU Meter. Be sure not to exceed 0dB. This will provide a good signal level to the camera and still offer plenty of headroom for higher transient signals.
- 3) Adjust the headphone volume control on the camera to a comfortable listening level.
- 4) You are ready to record.

Advanced Operation

Using Cameras that have Manual Audio Controls

If your camera allows you to disable the AGC feature we recommend that you do so to get the best performance. Set the camera to manual audio mode and adjust the camera gain so that the VU meter on the camera matches the VU meter on the adapter. This will usually be at a gain setting of 5 to 25% of maximum.

Notes on Getting the Best Audio Performance

The most common problem in recording professional audio on today's DSLR cameras is the hiss generated by the camera preamplifiers. You will never completely eliminate all hiss, which is normal, but you can reduce it so that it is no longer a problem. You can maximize the signal to noise ratio by reducing the relatively noisy camera gain and replacing it with the very clean gain in the adapter. The lower the camera gain, the lower the noise.

The most important thing to remember when recording audio is to set the signal levels correctly on the VU meter between 0 and -12dB.

Setting the recording levels too low will give you a poor signal to noise ratio and lead to poor results. Also, setting the levels too high will cause clipping and distortion. Having the proper levels will ensure that good clean audio signals are being sent to the camera for the highest quality audio.

Blackmagic Firmware

Blackmagic often changes the input sensitivity of their cameras with new firmware releases. On firmware 1.7 and under, the audio setting for Pocket camera should be set to 80% gain. On the current 1.8 firmware it should be set to 50% gain.
