# **Precautions**

## **Important Safety Warnings**

## [Power]

Caution	Operate unit <b>only</b> at the specified supply voltage.
	Disconnect the power cord via the power plug only. Do <b>not</b> pull on the cable portion.
Stop	Do <b>not</b> place or drop heavy or sharp-edged objects on the power cord. A damaged cord can cause fire or electrical shock hazards. Regularly check the power cord for excessive wear or damage to avoid possible fire / electrical hazards.
Caution	Ensure the power cord is firmly plugged into the AC outlet.


## [Grounding]

Caution	Ensure the unit is properly grounded at all times to prevent electrical shock.
Hazard	Do <b>not</b> ground the unit to gas lines, units, or fixtures of an explosive or dangerous nature.

## [Operation]

Hazard	Do <b>not</b> operate the unit under hazardous or potentially explosive atmospheric conditions. Doing so could result in fire, explosion, or other hazardous results.
Hazard	Do <b>not</b> allow liquids, metal pieces, or other foreign materials to enter the unit. Doing so could result in fire, other hazards, or a unit malfunction.
0=5	If a foreign material does enter the unit, turn the power off and <b>immediately</b> disconnect the power cord. Remove the material and contact an authorized service representative if damage has occurred.

# [Transportation]



## [Circuitry Access]



Do **not** remove covers, panels, casing, or access the circuitry with power applied to the unit. Turn the power off and disconnect the power cord prior to removal. Internal servicing / adjustment of unit should only be performed by qualified personnel.



Do **not** touch any parts / circuitry with a high heat factor.

Capacitors can retain enough electric charge to cause mild to serious shock, even after the power has been disconnected. Capacitors associated with the power supply are especially hazardous.



Unit should **not** be operated or stored with cover, panels, and / or casing removed. Operating the unit with circuitry exposed could result in electric shock / fire hazards or a unit malfunction.

## [Potential Hazards]



If abnormal odors or noises are noticed coming from the unit, immediately turn the power off and disconnect the power cord to avoid potentially hazardous conditions. If problems similar to the above occur, contact an authorized service representative **before** attempting to operate the unit again.

## [Rack Mount Brackets, Ground Terminal, and Rubber Feet]



To rack-mount or ground the unit, or to install rubber feet, do not use screws or materials other than those supplied. Doing so may cause damage to the internal circuits or components of the unit. If you remove the rubber feet that are attached to the unit, do not reinsert the screws that secure the rubber feet.

## [Consumables]



Consumable items that are used in the unit must be periodically replaced. For further details on which parts are consumables and when they should be replaced, refer to the specifications at the end of the Operation Manual. Since the service life of the consumables varies greatly depending on the environment in which they are used, such items should be replaced at an early date. For details on replacing consumable items, contact your dealer.

The FVW-700 units and their accessories are fully inspected and adjusted prior to shipment. Operation can be performed immediately upon completing all required connections and operational settings.



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# Installing the AC Cord Retention Clip

Secure the AC cord with the supplied ladder strap/retention clip assembly to prevent accidental removal from the unit.


## ♦ Installing the clip

- 1) Wrap the retention clip around the AC cord (with the anchor of the ladder strap toward the unit.)
- 2) Insert the anchor into the hole next to the AC IN socket.
- 3) Lightly fasten the clip around the AC cord.
- 4) Plug in the power cord.
- 5) Slide the clip on the ladder strap toward the plug.
- 6) Fasten the clip tightly.
- 7) Gently pull on the AC cord to ensure it is secured.



## ◆ Unplugging the AC cord

- 1) Push the tab on the retention clip up to unfasten the clip.
- 2) Push the tab on the ladder strap up and slide the clip back.
- 3) Unplug the AC cord.



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# 1. Prior to Starting

## 1-1. Overview

The FVW-700 system displays lines, objects, images, and movies onto video images in real time. Creating custom icons allow you to control the application via a touch screen. It is ideal for live broadcast environments, including weather news and sports.


## 1-3. Precautions on FVW-700 Use

When using the FVW-700, note the following points.

- Windows 10 is used and the OS is custormized for FVW-700.
   Do not change OS settings.
- Do not install software programs other than specified ones.
- Note that the C: drive of the FVW-700 is write-protected. Do not add folders and files to the C: drive. If files are saved to the C: drive, Windows OS may hang up. Although files are successflly saved to C: drive, the files will be lost when power is turned off.
- Save all folders and files to D: drive.




- When MAIN FAN/POWER FAN indicators light red, one or more cooling fans failed, turn off the power and contact your FOR-A agent.
- Pressing down the POWER switch for more than 5 seconds forces the power off. Apply this procedure only when problems occur. If the power is forced off while saving data, the data might be corrupted. Data corruption in such case are not covered under warranty.







# 3. Connection

## 3-1. Using a Touch Panel Monitor

The figure below illustrates a connection example.



Do not connect or disconnect cables while the power is on. Doing so may damage the internal circuitry.

## 3-1-1. Touch Panel Driver Installation

To use a touch panel screen, some monitors may require the installation of a touch panel driver. For the FVW-700, C: drive is write-protected. (Write protection needs to be disabled before driver installation.) Follow the steps below to disable the write protection, install the driver, and re-enable the write protection.

- 1. Click the x button in the upper right corner of the window to exit **VideoWriter**.
- 2. Right-click the uwf\_disable.bat in D:\forawork and click "Run as administrator".
- Command Prompt opens and shows the following messages. Press any key once on the keyboard.

The write-protection(UWF) for the boot drive(C:) is set to enable.

The any driver cannot install when write-protection is enabled.

Press any key to continue . . .

 The following messages appear. Check that **Disable** is shown in **Boot Command** and press any key once on the keyboard. **Command Prompt** closes and FVW-700 will restart automatically.

- 5. After restarting, **install the touch panel driver for your touch panel. Be sure to use the driver built for Window 10.** When using a tablet terminal as a remote controller, change IP address.
- 6. After installing the driver, right-click the **uwf\_enable.bat** in **D:\forawork** and click "Run as administrator".
- 7. **Command Prompt** opens and shows the following messages. Press any key once on the keyboard.

- 9. Windows shuts down automatically and the FVW-700 power supply turns off automatically.
- 10. Wait for about 5 seconds and turn on the front panel power switch.


Driver installation is complete.

## 3-2. Using Tablet Terminals as Remote Controllers (Option)

Install FVW-7-TRS into a tablet. The tablet synchronizes with the FVW-700 monitor (touch panel) via a wireless LAN and transmits touch information. Multiple tablets can be connected to an FVW-700.

#### **♦** Connection

FVW-700 system device connections with 2 tablet terminals are shown below.



## 3-2-1. IP Address Setting

Using a tablet terminal requires FVW-700 and tablet terminal IP addresses to be changed. Write protection needs to be disabled before IP address change. Follow the steps in Sec. 3-1-1. "Touch Panel Drive Installation" to disable the write protection, change IP addresses, and re-enable the write protection.

- 1. Click the |x| button in the upper right corner of the window to exit **VideoWriter**.
- 2. Right-click the START button and click Network Connections.
- 3. Right-click LAN 1 and click Property.
- 4. Select Internet Protocol Version 4 (TCP/IPv4) and click Property.
- 5. Check "**Use the following IP address**:" and input IP address. 192.168.1.50 is input here as an example.
- 6. Change the tablet-side IP address as well, the same as above.

## 3-2-2. VideoWriter Remote Control Settings

- 1. Startup VideoWriter software and open **Menu** > **Option** > **Remote**.
- 2. Select Enable under Work.
- 3. Select **Server** under **Server/Client** for an FVW-700 and select **Client** for a tablet terminal.

- 4 Input FVW-700 IP address set in Sec. 3-2-1. "IP Address Setting" in **Host**.
- 5. Click **OK** to close the screen.

Settings that allow a tablet terminal as a remote controller are now complete.

## **IMPORTANT**

When FVW-700 VideoWriter shuts down and restarts, the tablet-side software is automatically re-connected.

The following listed operations are not available tablet-side.

Still Capture, BG Capture and Modify buttons in Main Window.

Calibration, Load and Save in Menu dialog.

# 4. Using VideoWriter

See FVW-7SO Operation Manual for details on VideoWriter basic operations and settings.

## 4-1. Starting and Exiting VideoWriter

## Starting VideoWriter

On the desktop, double-click the shortcut to VideoWriter.

#### **NOTE**

VideoWriter is automatically started when the FVW-700 is powered on. Normally the application does not need to be manually started.

## ♦ Exiting VideoWriter



Main Window

A Shutdown operation is required before the FVW-700 is turned off. Select **Shutdown** from Windows **Start Menu**. The FVW-700 power turns off automatically.

## **IMPORTANT**

Pressing the POWER switch down for more than 5 seconds forces the power off when Windows becomes inoperable because of software issues. Apply this procedure only when problem occurs.

Unplug the FVW-700 power cord when unused for a long period of time.

## 4-2. System Setting

This section describes how to select the video format, reference signal and Lock Source, and to adjust genlock phases.

1. Click the **Menu** button in the main window.



2. Click the Option button.



3. The screen for video option settings appears allowing you to set various settings. Click **OK** when settings are complete.



# 4-3. Background Image or Movie Selection

This section describes how to select a background image. Select a background image by clicking a background button in the VideoWriter main window as shown below.

When Live is clicked, the movie stream that is input to FVW-700 SDI IN is applied. (Default: Live)

## 4-4. Composite out Settings

This section describes how to set output images and VW objects. Allows you to select output images from FVW-700 SDI OUT1 and SDI OUT3.

Open FVW-700 Menu >Option > Video dialog.



- Set output images from SDI OUT1 in Video OUT1. (Default: Mix)
   Mix: Outputs background image and VW-created object composition from SDI OUT1.
   VW Only: Outputs VW-created objects only from SDI OUT1.
- 3. Set output images from SDI OUT3 in Video Out2. (Default: Mix)

4. When set to **Mix** for Video OUT1 / Video OUT2, click the Main window **DSK** button. When the button turns red, background and VW objects composite images are out from SDI OUT1 / SDI OUT3.



## 4-5. Saving Settings

This section describes how to save the current screen image, draw tool property settings, and background button settings into a file. File extension is **.vwf**.



- 1. Click the **Menu** button in the VideoWriter main window.
- 2. Menu dialog box appears. Click Save.
- 3. Save As dialog box appears. Input file name and directory and click Save.
- 4. Returns to the **Menu** dialog box. Clicking **OK** closes the dialog box and current settings are saved into a file.

# 4-6. Loading Settings

This section describes how to load settings saved under Sec. 4-5. "Saving Settings."



- 1. Click the **Menu** button in VideoWriter main window.
- 2. The **Menu** dialog box appears. Click **Load**.
- 3. An **Open** dialog box appears. Select the file (.vwf) to load and click **OK**.
- 4. Returns to the **Menu** dialog box. Clicking **OK** closes the dialog box and loads the selected settings.

## 5. Resetting to Default


To reset the above settings to default, follow the below procedure.

- (1) In VideoWriter software, click the x button in the upper right corner of the main window to close the application.
- (2) Go to START > Control Panel > Programs and Features and double-click "Video Writer Version.x.x.x.x."

The figure below shows an example for version 3.0.0.7.



(3) Click **Yes** in the following confirmation dialog box to uninstall the software but not delete the license file. License confirmation is not required when VideoWriter is re-installed.



(4) Follow steps 1 to 8 in Sec. 2-5. "Installing FVW-7SO / FVW-7-TRS" of FVW-7SO Operation Manual to re-install VideoWriter. When you start up the VideoWriter after re-installation, it starts up at factory default settings.



# Appendix 1. How to Reset BIOS

In case the operating system cannot be started due to the lack of battery power which backs up the BIOS settings, please consult your FOR-A reseller. Be sure to ask the FOR-A reseller to replace the battery, because some mechanical ability is required for the battery replacement.


If you urge to recover the unit, it is possible for the moment by following the procedure below to reset the BIOS.

## 1. Opening BIOS Setup Menu

- 1. Connect a PC monitor to the DVI-I port and a keyboard and mouse to the USB ports on the rear of the device and turn on the power
- 2. The screen appears as below. Press the F2 key.



3. The Phoenix SecureCore Technology Setup screen appears.







## ◆ Default configuration


- (a) On the menu bar, select **Exit** using the right and left arrow keys.
- (b) Select Load Setup Defaults using the up and down arrow keys, and press Enter.
   A confirmation message appears asking if you want to load the default configuration settings.
   Press Enter. The default configuration settings will load.



- (1) Date and time settings
  - (a) On the menu bar, select Main using the right and left arrow keys.
  - (b) Select **System Date** using the up and down arrow keys, and enter the current date using the numeric keys. Press **Enter** to confirm an entry and move the cursor to month/day/year. In the same way, set the current time under **System Time**.




(2) Configuration menu On the menu bar, select Configuration using the right and left arrow keys. The Configuration menu screen appears.





## ◆ PCI/PCIE Configuration

IF YOU LIVE IN (OR IF YOUR PRINCIPAL PLACE OF BUSINESS IS IN) THE UNITED STATES, PLEASE READ THE BINDING ARBITRATION CLAUSE AND CLASS ACTION WAIVER IN SECTION 9. IT AFFECTS HOW DISPUTES ARE RESOLVED.

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This agreement describes your rights and the conditions upon which you may use the Windows software. You should review the entire agreement, including any supplemental license terms that accompany the software and any linked terms, because all of the terms are important and together create this agreement that applies to you. You can review linked terms by pasting the (aka.ms/) link into a browser window.

By accepting this agreement or using the software, you agree to all of these terms, and consent to the transmission of certain information during activation and during your use of the software as per the privacy statement described in Section 3. If you do not accept and comply with these terms, you may not use the software or its features. You may contact the device manufacturer or installer, or your retailer if you purchased the software directly, to determine its return policy and return the software or device for a refund or credit under that policy. You must comply with that policy, which might require you to return the software with the entire device on which the software is installed for a refund or credit, if any.

#### 1. Overview.

- **b. Device.** In this agreement, "device" means a physical hardware system) with an internal storage device capable of running the software. A hardware partition or blade is considered to be a device.
- **c. Restrictions.** The manufacturer or installer and Microsoft reserve all rights (such as rights under intellectual property laws) not expressly granted in this agreement. For example, this license does not give you any right to, and you may not:
  - (i) use or virtualize features of the software separately;
  - (ii) publish, copy (other than the permitted backup copy), rent, lease, or lend the software;

#### d. Multi use scenarios.

Hardware or software you use to multiplex or pool connections, or reduce the number of devices or users that access or use the software, does not reduce the number of licenses you need. We hope we never have a dispute, but if we do, you and we agree to try for 60 days to resolve it informally. If we can't, you and we agree to binding individual arbitration before the American Arbitration Association ("AAA") under the Federal Arbitration Act ("FAA"), and not to sue in court in front of a judge or jury. Instead, a neutral arbitrator will decide and the arbitrator's decision will be final except for a limited right of appeal under the FAA. Class action lawsuits, class-wide arbitrations, private attorney-general actions, and any other proceeding where someone acts in a representative capacity aren't allowed. Nor is combining individual proceedings without the consent of all parties. "We," "our," and "us" includes Microsoft, the device manufacturer, and software installer.

- a. Disputes covered—everything except IP. The term "dispute" is as broad as it can be. After 60 days, you or we may start an arbitration if the dispute is unresolved.
- c. Small claims court option. Instead of mailing a Notice of Dispute, and if you meet the court's requirements, you may sue us in small claims court in your county of residence (or if a business your principal place of business) or our principal place of business—King County, Washington USA if your dispute is with Microsoft. We hope you'll mail a Notice of Dispute and give us 60 days to try to work it out, but you don't have to before going to small claims court.
- d. Arbitration procedure. The AAA will conduct any arbitration under its Commercial Arbitration Rules (or if you are an individual and use the software for personal or household use, or if the value of the dispute is \$75,000 USD or less whether or not you are an individual or how you use the software, its Consumer Arbitration Rules). For more information, see (aka.ms/adr) or call 1-800-778-7879. To start an arbitration, submit the form available at (aka.ms/arbitration) to the AAA; mail a copy to the manufacturer or installer (or to Microsoft if your dispute is with Microsoft). In a dispute involving \$25,000 USD or less, any hearing will be telephonic unless the arbitrator finds good cause to hold an in-person hearing instead. Any in-person hearing will take place in your county of residence (of if a business your principal place of business) or our principal place of business—King County, Washington if your dispute is with Microsoft. You choose. The arbitrator may award the same damages to you individually as a court could. The arbitrator may award declaratory or injunctive relief only to you individually to satisfy your individual claim.

#### e. Arbitration fees and payments.

(i) **Disputes involving \$75,000 USD or less**. The manufacturer or installer (or Microsoft if your dispute is with Microsoft) will promptly reimburse your filing fees and pay the AAA's and arbitrator's fees and expenses. If you reject our last written settlement offer made before the arbitrator was appointed, your dispute goes all the way to an arbitrator's decision (called an "award"), and the arbitrator awards you more than this last written offer, the manufacturer or installer (or Microsoft if your dispute is with Microsoft) will: (1) pay the greater of the award or \$1,000

- USD; (2) pay your reasonable attorney's fees, if any; and (3) reimburse any expenses (including expert witness fees and costs) that your attorney reasonably accrues for investigating, preparing, and pursuing your claim in arbitration. The arbitrator will determine the amounts unless you and we agree on them.
- (ii) **Disputes involving more than \$75,000 USD.** The AAA rules will govern payment of filing fees and the AAA's and arbitrator's fees and expenses.
- (iii) **Disputes involving any amount.** If you start an arbitration we won't seek our AAA or arbitrator's fees and expenses, or your filing fees we reimbursed, unless the arbitrator finds the arbitration frivolous or brought for an improper purpose. If we start an arbitration we will pay all filing, AAA, and arbitrator's fees and expenses. We won't seek our attorney's fees or expenses from you in any arbitration. Fees and expenses are not counted in determining how much a dispute involves.
- **f. Must file within one year.** You and we must file in small claims court or arbitration any claim or dispute (except intellectual property disputes see Section 9.a.) within one year from when it first could be filed. Otherwise, it's permanently barred.
- g. Severability. If the class action waiver is found to be illegal or unenforceable as to all or some parts of a dispute, those parts won't be arbitrated but will proceed in court, with the rest proceeding in arbitration. If any other provision of Section 9 is found to be illegal or unenforceable, that provision will be severed but the rest of Section 9 still applies.
- h. **Conflict with AAA rules.** This agreement governs if it conflicts with the AAA's Commercial Arbitration Rules or Consumer Arbitration Rules.
- i. Microsoft as party or third-party beneficiary. If Microsoft is the device manufacturer or if you acquired the software from a retailer, Microsoft is a party to this agreement. You may also have rights with respect to the party from which you acquired the software. This agreement does not change those other rights if the laws of your state or country do not permit it to do so. For example, if you acquired the software in one of the below regions, or mandatory country law applies, then the following provisions apply to you:
