



Important Safety Instructions



SAVE THESE INSTRUCTIONS!

This manual contains important instructions and warnings that should be followed during the installation, operation and storage of this Tripp Lite product. Failure to heed these warnings may affect your warranty.

PDU/Switch Location Warnings

- The switch provides the convenience of multiple outlets, but DOES NOT provide surge or line noise protection for connected equipment.
- The switch is designed for indoor use only, in a controlled environment, away from excess moisture, temperature extremes, conductive contaminants, dust or direct sunlight.
- For best performance, maintain an indoor temperature between 32° F and 104° F (0° C and 40° C) with relative humidity between 10% and 90% (non-condensing).
- Install in accordance with National Electrical Code standards. Be sure to use the proper overcurrent protection for the installation in accordance with the plug/equipment rating.
- Leave adequate space around all sides of the switch for proper ventilation.
- Keep the switch away from high-frequency, strong-current devices (e.g., radio transmitting stations, transmitters and broadband amplifiers).
- Use electromagnetic shielding (if required).
- For rackmount configuration, ensure that both the rack and switch are properly grounded.
- If the switch is not rack mounted, securely place it on a sturdy, flat surface.
- The electrical outlets supplying power to the equipment should be installed near the equipment and easily accessible.
- Improper installation can cause product damage that is not covered by the warranty.
- Do not expose the network switch's connected networking cables to outdoor elements.
- Do not use this product near water (e.g., in a wet basement, or near a swimming pool).

PDU/Switch Connection Warnings

- Use of this equipment in life support applications where failure of this equipment can reasonably be expected to cause the failure of the life support equipment or to significantly affect its safety or effectiveness is not recommended. Do not use this equipment in the presence of a flammable anesthetic mixture with air, oxygen or nitrous oxide.
- Keep the switch's input power off during installation.
- Use only the power cord that came included with the switch.
- Make sure the power supply voltage matches the specifications indicated on the switch.
- The total power requirement for equipment connected to the switch must not exceed the maximum load rating for the PDU's circuit breaker.
- Do not connect the switch to an ungrounded outlet or to extension cords or adapters that eliminate the connection to ground.
- Do not drill into or attempt to open any part of the switch housing. There are no user-serviceable parts inside.
- Do not attempt to modify the switch, including the input plugs and power cables.
- Do not attempt to use the switch if any part of it becomes damaged.
- Make sure network cables are properly seated. A clicking sound will be made when a cable is installed correctly.
- If the power cord is damaged, do not attempt to connect the switch. Contact a Tripp Lite Service Representative for assistance.
- Never attempt to install or use the switch during a thunderstorm.

Avertissement concernant l'emplacement de la PDU/du commutateur


- Le commutateur fournit des prises multiples pratiques, mais elle ne FOURNIT PAS de protection contre les surtensions ou les bruits de ligne pour l'équipement connecté.
- Le commutateur est conçue pour être utilisée à l'intérieur uniquement, dans un environnement contrôlé, à l'écart de l'excès d'humidité, des températures extrêmes, des contaminants conducteurs, de la poussière et de la lumière directe du soleil.
- Pour un rendement optimal, maintenez la température intérieure entre 32 °F et 104 °F (0 °C et 40 °C) avec une humidité relative comprise entre 10 et 90 % (sans condensation).
- Installer conformément aux codes locaux de l'électricité. S'assurer d'utiliser la bonne protection contre les surintensités pour l'installation, conformément aux valeurs nominales de la fiche et de l'équipement.
- Laisser suffisamment d'espace tout autour du commutateur pour assurer une bonne ventilation.
- Garder le commutateur à l'écart des appareils haute fréquence et à courant fort (p. ex. station émettrice de radio, transmetteurs et amplificateurs à large bande).
- Utiliser une protection électromagnétique (le cas échéant).
- Pour une configuration de montage en bâti, s'assurer que le bâti et le commutateur sont correctement mis à la masse.
- Si le commutateur n'est pas monté en bâti, le placer solidement sur une surface solide et à plat.
- Les prises électriques qui alimentent l'équipement doivent être installées à proximité de l'équipement et être facilement accessibles.
- Une mauvaise installation risque de causer des dommages au produit qui ne sont pas couverts par la garantie.
- Ne pas exposer les câbles de réseautage connectés du commutateur réseau aux éléments extérieurs.
- Ne pas utiliser ce produit à proximité de l'eau (p. ex. dans un sous-sol humide ou à proximité d'une piscine).


- Il n'est pas recommandé d'utiliser cet équipement dans les applications de soutien vital où une panne de cet équipement serait susceptible de causer une panne de l'équipement de soutien vital ou d'affecter sérieusement sa sécurité ou son efficacité. - Garder l'alimentation d'entrée du commutateur hors tension durant l'installation.

- Ne pas connecter le commutateur dans une prise non mise à la masse ou des rallonges électriques ou des adaptateurs qui éliminent la connexion à la masse.
- Ne pas percer ou tenter d'ouvrir une quelconque partie du boîtier du commutateur. Il n'existe aucune pièce réparable par l'utilisateur à l'intérieur.
- Ne pas tenter de modifier le commutateur, y compris les fiches d'entrée et les câbles d'alimentation.
- Ne pas tenter d'utiliser le commutateur si une de ses pièces est endommagée.
- S'assurer que les câbles du réseau reposent correctement en place. Un bruit de cliquetis sera émis lorsqu'un câble est installé correctement.
- Si le cordon d'alimentation est endommagé, ne pas tenter de connecter le commutateur. Contactez votre représentant(e) Tripp Lite pour obtenir de l'aide.
- Ne jamais essayer d'installer ou d'utiliser le commutateur pendant un orage.




- ① **Gigabit Ethernet Ports:** These 24 twisted-pair RJ-45 ports support auto-negotiable 10/100/1000 Mbps and auto MDI/MDIX cross-over detection functions for true “plug and play” capability.
Note: Not compatible with PoE (Power Over Ethernet) applications.
- ② **Power ON/OFF LED:** An LED illuminates to indicate that the switch is receiving power.
- ③ **Port Status LEDs:** These 24 green LEDs illuminate to indicate the link speed. The LED will be off for 10 Mbps and solid green for 100 Mbps and 1000 Mbps. There are also 24 yellow LEDs that blink to indicate activity on each port.
- ④ **NEMA 5-15R Outlets:** This switch includes 12 NEMA 5-15R receptacles.
- ⑤ **Circuit Breaker:** If the current drawn by the equipment connected to the PDU exceeds the Maximum Load Rating, the 12A thermal circuit breaker will trip to prevent possible damage and its plunger will pop up. If this happens, disconnect excess equipment and allow the breaker to cool at least one minute before depressing the plunger to reset the unit.
- ⑥ **Input:** AC power input from a connected UPS system or alternate source.
- ⑦ **Grounding Lug:** Use this screw to connect other equipment to ground.

Quick Installation

1U Rackmount Installation

- 1 Mount the switch using either the four cage nuts **A**, washers **B** and screws **C** provided or four user-supplied rackmount screws **D**. The user must determine the fitness of the rackmount screws to hold the unit in the rack before installation.
- 2 Connect the switch to a properly grounded outlet. The POWER LED will illuminate when the switch turns on.
- 3 Connect the network cables to the network switch.
- 4 Connect equipment to the PDU outlets. Make sure the load connected does not exceed the PDU's circuit breaker rating.



Warranty & Product Registration

5-Year Limited Warranty

TRIPP LITE warrants its products to be free from defects in materials and workmanship for a period of five (5) years from the date of initial purchase. TRIPP LITE's obligation under this warranty is limited to repairing or replacing (at its sole option) any such defective products. To obtain service under this warranty, you must obtain a Returned Material Authorization (RMA) number from TRIPP LITE or an authorized TRIPP LITE service center. Products must be returned to TRIPP LITE or an authorized TRIPP LITE service center with transportation charges prepaid and must be accompanied by a brief description of the problem encountered and proof of date and place of purchase. This warranty does not apply to equipment which has been damaged by accident, negligence or misapplication or has been altered or modified in any way.

Regulatory Compliance Identification Numbers

For the purpose of regulatory compliance certifications and identification, your Tripp Lite product has been assigned a unique series number. The series number can be found on the product nameplate label, along with all required approval markings and information. When requesting compliance information for this product, always refer to the series number. The series number should not be confused with the marketing name or model number of the product.
